SAILOR OR OFFICER?

YOUR CHOICE WILL DEPEND ON THE JOB YOU'RE INTERESTED IN AND THE QUALIFICATIONS YOU'VE GAINED AT SCHOOL AND BEYOND.

BECOME A NAVY SAILOR

You don't need a degree or experience to take up this exciting opportunity. As a Navy sailor you'll receive comprehensive training for your role and acquire hands-on skills and knowledge that benefit you for life.

You'll require a minimum of Year 10 qualifications to apply for a sailor role, which will involve supporting the everyday operations of your submarine – in roles ranging from cooking to technical maintenance. Once you have joined, the Navy will train you until you're fully qualified in your trade or job role.

You can apply to be an officer with Year 12 qualifications, joining directly for a leadership role, or join via the Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA) with a fully paid-for degree in roles such as engineering.

If you're midway through a degree at an ADF approved university, you may be able to apply for sponsorship. Defence University Sponsorship (DUS) is for you if you're already studying a relevant degree. With sponsorship we pay you to complete your degree and pay remaining fees.

SPECIALIST TRAINING

All Submariners undertake standard Navy training in either sailor or officer streams. Once you've been identified as having the mental and physical resources to become a Submariner, you'll then undergo your specialist training.

BECOME A NAVY OFFICER

As a Navy officer you'll learn how to take command, mentor and motivate others, and make a positive contribution to globally significant missions and operations.



SONAR OPERATOR

Operate, supervise and manage all passive and active sonars and acoustic sensors onboard submarines to avoid being detected. You'll track, classify and detect noise sources in the ocean, passing the information that you gather onto your team.

COMMUNICATION NETWORKS OPERATOR SUBMARINER

Operate the Navy's subsurface communication and IT systems to make sure that information remains secure and that the lines of communication remain uninterrupted. You'll act as the communications hub onboard, receiving, sending and providing all communication and information to relevant stakeholders, Command and crew.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Year 10 completion with passes in English and Mathematics

Operate surveillance systems to identify, track and monitor potential threats. You will also intercept and analyse electromagnetic emissions to identify unknown and nearby entities, like sonars and vessels.

- Year 10 completion with passes in English, Mathematics and Science (preferably with Physics content)

ELECTRONICS TECHNICIAN SUBMARINER

Be a tradie operating, maintaining, diagnosing and repairing advanced technical and military hardware onboard submarines, including underwater sensors, combat and weapons systems, navigation aids and electronic warfare systems.

ENTRY OPTIONS

- Full time – Unqualified

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Year 10 completion with passes in English, Mathematics and Science (preferably with Physics content)

Work in a team to provide quality hospitality services to the submarine's crew, serve VIPs, manage canteens, and serve at events and functions such as cocktail parties, formal dinners, and diplomatic functions.

ENTRY OPTIONS

- Full time – Unqualified

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Year 10 completion with passes in English and Mathematics.

MARINE TECHNICIAN SUBMARINER

Be a tradie responsible for operating, maintaining and monitoring propulsion, electrical and auxiliary engineering systems onboard the submarine. You'll work at sea and ashore on diesel engines, electrical systems, propulsion machinery and more.

ENTRY OPTION

- Full time – Unqualified

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Year 10 completion with passes in English, Mathematics and Science

SAILOR

OFFICER

Be responsible for administering advanced first aid, nursing care, emergency medical care, managing medical supplies and more onboard a submarine. You will care for the sick and wounded and be exposed to both conventional and unconventional injuries and illnesses in a variety of situations.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Year 10 Mathematics
- Year 11 English and Biology (Chemistry is highly desirable).

WAREHOUSE STOREPERSON SUBMARINER

Manage the logistics and inventory of supplies, equipment, provisions and spare parts to make sure the submarine has everything it needs while at sea.

- Year 10 completion with passes in English and Mathematics

Manage a team that monitors, maintains and repairs the communications, radar, sonar, navigation, combat data, fire control and weapon systems onboard submarines and ashore.

- Join via a degree course undertaken at the Australian Defence Force Academy
- Join while studying at an accredited university and have your remaining fees sponsored by the Navy
- Join the Navy fully degree qualified

MECHANICAL ENGINEER SUBMARINER

Manage a team that's responsible for monitoring, maintaining and repairing submarine structures, propulsion systems, electrical generation and distribution systems, and domestic and associated mechanical services, onboard submarines and ashore.

ENTRY OPTIONS

- Join via a degree course undertaken at the Australian Defence Force Academy
- Join while studying at an accredited university and have your remaining fees sponsored by the Navy
- Join the Navy fully degree qualified

SAILOR

OFFICER

Lead a team and oversee the control of navigation systems, weapons systems and maritime safety of Navy submarines.

ENTRY OPTIONS

- Join with Year 12 passes in English and three other accredited subjects
- Join via a degree course undertaken at the Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA)
- Join while studying at an accredited university and have your remaining fees sponsored by the Navy

Provides information and manages your expectations for your career and lifestyle as a Submariner so that you can make a fully informed decision.

Includes tours of a Submarine (or VR tour), Submarine Training and Systems Centre and discuss your career path with a qualified Submariner.



SPECIFIC JOB TRAINING

If you have been identified as having what it takes to become a Submariner, you'll undertake training that prepares you for your specific role, in areas such as:

- Leadership and ship management
- Technical support and engineering
- Communication and sensor systems operation
- Logistics, catering and hospitality

Navy training is highly regarded in the civilian world – and the technical, life and leadership skills you'll acquire are fully transferable.

SUBMARINE ESCAPE TRAINING

Escape Training Course

🕒 3.5 days

📍 HMAS Stirling, Perth WA

The course will cover the theory behind submarine safety and rescue, and include a practical lesson where trainees will participate in a controlled 'blow and go' exercise, a technique used in scuba diving.

SUBMARINE FAMILIARISATION

Initial Collins Class Course (ICCC)

🕒 5 weeks

📍 HMAS Stirling, Perth WA

Consists of a series of computer based and instructor-based modules that introduces you to how the systems and construction make up the submarines. You will also undertake Submarine Firefighting and Submarine Escape courses during this 5-week period.

GRADUATE WITH THE DOLPHINS BADGE

You'll receive your 'Dolphins' on completion of Submariner training and after time spent at sea refining your skills. This highly prestigious badge can only be worn by sailors and officers who have proudly earned the right to serve on the Royal Australian Navy's submarines.

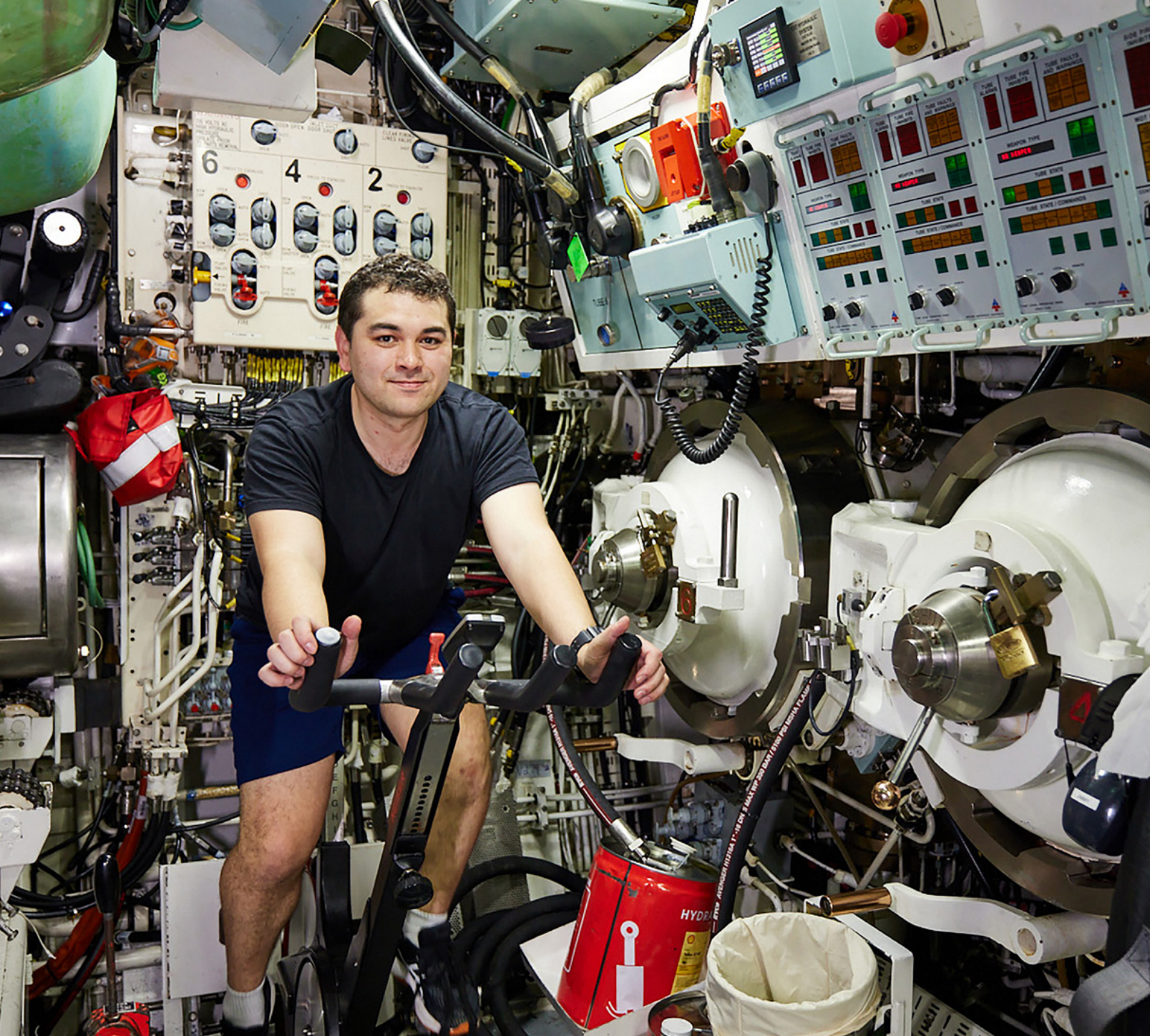

FITNESS

SUFFICIENT GENERAL FITNESS TO PASS A PRE-ENTRY FITNESS ASSESSMENT (PFA)

As part of your pre-entry fitness assessment (PFA), you will need to complete a number of specific exercises to a certain standard.

The exercises vary across gender and age, and fitness standards differ for Navy Diver. To find out which exercises and standards are relevant to you, visit the health & fitness page on adfcareers.gov.au.

Once you join, you will be required to pass a basic swim test, consisting of a 3-metre platform jump, a 50-metre swim, a 10-metre underwater swim and a 15-minute treading water exercise.

ATTEND AN ASSESSMENT SESSION

Undertake a medical assessment and attend psychological and job interviews to have your leadership, teamwork and other areas of potential assessed.

5

COMPLETE A PRE-ENTRY FITNESS ASSESSMENT

You will need to complete a fitness assessment that consists of completing a number of specific exercises to a certain standard.*

Have a final medical check, join family and friends for the welcome ceremony, then head straight to Recruit School and an exciting new career in the Navy.
